## PLEASANT PLAINS TOWNSHIP LAKE COUNTY, MICHIGAN (Ordinance No. 9-30 -24 - 1

At a <u>Public</u> meeting of the Township Board for Pleasant Township held on for adoption by Township Board Member <u>Fustee</u> husself, and was seconded by Township Board Member <u>Trustee</u> Lemm:

AN ORDINANCE TO IMPOSE A TEMPORARY ADMINISTRATIVE MORATORIUM ON THE PROCESSING AND ISSUANCE OF ANY TOWNSHIP APPLICATION, PERMIT, LICENSE, ZONING APPROVAL, REZONING, VARIANCE, OR OTHER APPROVAL FOR ANY NEW MARIHUANA BUSINESS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP

## THE TOWNSHIP OF PLEASANT PLAINS (the "Township") ORDAINS:

## Section 1. Findings and Purpose.

- (a) The Township Board finds that this Ordinance is necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare of Township property owners, residents, and visitors.
- (b) The Township Board finds that this Ordinance is necessary in order to:
  - (1) Discourage the sale of unsafe or unlicensed marihuana products;
  - (2) Minimize the unsafe or unregulated production and sale of marihuana;
  - (3) Address concerns regarding recent events pertaining to the sale of marihuana and the operation of marihuana businesses within the Township; and
  - (4) Provide clarification regarding the process by which marihuana businesses may be authorized to operate within the Township.
- (c) The Township is working diligently on amending current ordinances that pertain to the licensing and regulation of marihuana businesses.

- (g) During the term of this moratorium, any new marihuana business that has a Township marihuana license application pending with the Township may withdraw its Township marihuana license application. The withdrawal of an application must be in writing. Following the withdrawal of an application, the Township will refund the application fee that was paid.
- Section 4. <u>Moratorium Term</u>. Unless repealed by a subsequent ordinance, the temporary administrative moratorium imposed by this Ordinance will remain in effect for six months following the effective date of this Ordinance. Prior to the expiration of the initial sixmonth term of the moratorium, the Township Board may, by resolution, extend the moratorium term by another four months if it determines such extension is necessary to accomplish the purpose of this Ordinance.

Section 5. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance is effective the day following the date of the publication of the Ordinance or a summary of the Ordinance as required by law.
